

LANCASTER COUNTY ELECTION BOARD MEETING

Commissioner D'Agostino called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m.

Commissioner D'Agostino announced approval of the October 1, 2025, Election Board meeting minutes and the October 7, 2025, Election Board meeting minutes.

ELECTION BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 12 OF 2025

On motion of Commissioner Parsons, seconded by Commissioner Yoder;

WHEREAS There are vacancies on various election boards in a number of election districts in Lancaster County which remain unfilled; and

WHEREAS Section 405 of the Pennsylvania Election Code authorizes the County Board of Elections to appoint qualified electors who have been trained by the County to perform the duties of election officers to fill vacancies on election boards that occur within five days of the date of any election; and

WHEREAS The Board of Elections has a pool of qualified electors who have been trained by the County to perform the duties of election officials and are willing to serve at the General Election to be held on November 4, 2025, and desires to make the authorized appointments; and

WHEREAS Section 404 of the Election Code authorizes the County Board of Elections to appoint a qualified registered elector from the county to serve as a machine inspector in any election district in which more than one voting machine is utilized; and

WHEREAS There are a number of election districts in Lancaster County in which multiple voting machines are used; and

WHEREAS The Board of Elections desires to appoint qualified registered electors as machine inspectors in those districts in which multiple voting machines are used.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS OF LANCASTER COUNTY PENNSYLVANIA, as follows:

1. Pursuant to Section 405 of the Election Code, the Board appoints the persons identified in the Court Appointment Report attached to this Resolution to fill vacancies in the various election boards as more fully set forth in the Report. The appointments shall be valid only for November 4, 2025, the day of the General Election. Any election board position filled by appointment herein shall be deemed vacant as of the day following the General Election.

2. Pursuant to Section 404 of the Election Code, the Board appoints the persons identified in Court Appointment Report attached to this Resolution as machine inspectors in those election districts where multiple voting machines are utilized, as more fully set forth in the Court Appointment Report. The appointments shall be valid only for November 5, 2024, the day of the General Election.
3. Pursuant to Act 12 of 2020, the Board appoints the persons identified in Exhibit A attached to this Resolution to assist with pre-canvassing and canvassing of ballots. The appointments shall be valid for the November 4, 2025, General Election and shall continue until all pre-canvassing and canvassing duties have been completed.

Motion passed unanimously.

Update on the 2025 Municipal Election

Christa Miller, Chief Clerk/Chief Registrar

Christa Miller reported that there are currently 360,083 eligible voters for the Municipal Election, of which 111,029 are Democratic, 184,141 are Republican, and 64,913 are third party. This is the highest number ever recorded for a Municipal Election.

There were 37,303 mail ballot requests, of which 27,961 had been returned as of Saturday afternoon, and the Election and Voter Registration Office is currently working on processing another 300.

Christa Miller stated she is expecting a crew of about 40 volunteers to come tomorrow, Election Day, to help. She also reminded everyone that the 0608 precinct in the city had an emergency court order for a polling place change during the spring election, but it has now been moved back to its regular location on East Walnut Street.

Christa Miller also reminded everyone that tomorrow, Election Day, there will be an Election Board meeting in Rooms 102/104 to begin the pre-canvass and opening of mail-in ballots, and then on Friday, November 7, at 9:00 a.m., the official canvass will begin to review provisional ballots, reconciliation, military ballots, and write-ins. The results will then be posted, and certification is scheduled for November 24

On motion of Commissioner Yoder, seconded by Commissioner Parsons, the meeting adjourned at 11:11 a.m.
