

# Directions to Lancaster County Planning

### Arriving to the Building

**On Foot / By Bicycle:** A bicycle rack is located on the Binns Park side of the tower.

**By Car:** Metered on-street parking is available on Prince Street and Queen Street. Payments can be made at the nearest kiosk or online. Nearby garages include the Prince Street Garage (Prince Street & Orange Street), RRTA Queen Street Station Garage (Queen Street & Chestnut Street), Christian Street Garage (North Duke Street), and Duke Street Garage (Duke Street & Chestnut Street). Although Level 3 of the Prince Street Garage opens into Binns Park, the security door is only accessible to those with a monthly parking pass. To leave the Prince Street Garage, use the Prince Street or Orange Street exits.

### Entering the Building

**Public Entrance:** The public must use the Chestnut Street entrance to enter the building. The Binns Park entrance is for employees only.

**Security:** All visitors are required to go through security. Your possessions will be scanned and you will walk through a metal detector and/or be wanded by security personnel.

### Finding Your Way Inside

Security personnel can assist you with directions. The building has two sections: a 7-story tower facing Chestnut Street and a 3-story annex facing Binns Park and Queen Street. The public entrance to the building is in the tower. The Planning Department office and all conference rooms (102, 104, A, and B) are in the annex.

#### **Planning Department Office / Conference Rooms A and B | Annex – 3rd Floor, Suite 320**

Go past the tower elevators, turn right into the waiting area, then turn left. Walk down the long hall and straight through the door with the glass surround. Turn right, enter an elevator, and go to the 3rd floor. When the doors open, the Planning Department office is on the left. Sign in at the receptionist window and phone 8333 to let someone know you have arrived.

#### **Conference Room 102 | Annex – 1st Floor**

Go past the tower elevators, turn right into the waiting area, then turn left. Walk down the long hall and straight through the door with the glass surround. Continue straight past the elevators to the Binns Park lobby. Room 102 is in the far-right corner of the lobby, behind the double wooden doors.

#### **Conference Room 104 | Annex – 1st Floor**

Go past the tower elevators, turn right into the waiting area, then turn left. Walk down the long hall and straight through the door with the glass surround. Continue straight past the elevators to the Binns Park lobby. Straight ahead, look for a wooden door leading to Veterans Affairs and the restrooms. Go through the door, continue to the end of the short hall, and turn right to Room 104.

## Getting to Downtown Lancaster

### FROM THE NORTHWEST (MOUNT JOY / HARRISBURG):

Take PA 283 East to Fruitville Pike exit. Stay right. Follow sign for Fruitville Pike – South (becomes Prince Street). Stay on Prince Street past Clipper Stadium and Walnut Street.

### FROM THE WEST (COLUMBIA / YORK):

Take US 30 East to Harrisburg / Downtown Lancaster exit. Stay right. Follow sign for Fruitville Pike – South (becomes Prince Street). Stay on Prince Street past Clipper Stadium and Walnut Street.

### FROM THE SOUTH (WILLOW STREET / MARYLAND):

Take Willow Street Pike/US 222 North (becomes Queen Street). Stay on Queen Street when US 222 veers right on Church Street. Go past King Street at Penn Square.

### FROM THE EAST (GAP / PHILADELPHIA):

Take US 30 West. Follow sign for York / Harrisburg to get on US 30 bypass. Go past Greenfield Road exit. Take next exit, PA 23 West / Walnut Street. At end of ramp, turn right and continue for about 2 miles into city, past Plum Street, Shippen Street, and Lime Street.
