ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

AND NOW this 6th day of October 2025, it is hereby **ORDERED** that attorneys and/or *pro se* litigants (a party representing himself or herself) shall disclose, in clear and plain factual statement, any use of generative Artificial Intelligence (“AI”) in the preparation of any complaint, answer, motion, brief, or other paper filed with the Court. If counsel (or a party representing himself or herself) has used generative AI, he or she must include with the document an Affidavit of Use of Generative AI in which the party must disclose and certify by affidavit attached to this administrative order:

- a. The specific AI tool that was used;
- b. Precisely which portions of the filing were prepared by the AI program; and
- c. That a human being has checked the accuracy of any portion of the document generated by AI, including all citations and legal authority.

Failure to comply with this Order may result in sanctions.
